Briefly describe your animal programs:

Suncoast Humane Society offers a variety of programs and services to ensure the wellbeing and humane treatment of animals; these include a Foster Care Program, placing sick or younger pets into suitable foster homes, taking care of their medical and behavioral needs until they are deemed suitable for adoption. Pet Adoptions are processed through trained adoption counselors ensuring the most appropriate placement is made. Low-cost spay/neuter and micro-chipping is offered to the public and Suncoast Humane Society has a variety of Humane Education programs including Pet Therapy, Critter Camp, Critters in the Classroom and Doggie Tales, designed to encourage and improve children's reading skills. Other programs include offsite adoptions, volunteering, lost and found services. Suncoast Humane Society is a designated emergency shelter. More recently, in response to the current financial climate, Suncoast Humane Society has introduced a low cost preventive care programs, targeted to assist low income families maintain the necessary vaccinations and treatments for their pets. Another program which we are paticulary proud of is our Pet Pantry program, partnering with other civic organizations to deliver pet food to families who are struggling to provide for their pets.

Established in 1971, Suncoast Humane Society "exists to reduce the number of homeless animals and improve the quality of human and animal life through their companionship." Suncoast Humane Society is an open admission shelter committed to its policy of never turning any animal away. The support and confidence of the community has continued to grow and as a need for additional services is recognized, Suncoast Humane Society has successfully implemented the necessary programs to meet these needs. Phillip Snyder, Executive Director has over thirty years' experience in the animal care and control field. This includes fifteen years as Director of two regional offices of the Humane Society of the United States and Executive Director of five local humane societies and animal control organizations. Skilled in organization and program development in all areas of animal sheltering, Phillip Snyder is especially qualified and experienced in the implementation of new programs, most particularly, low/no-cost spay and neuter programs. With direction from Phil Snyder, and with the addition of a qualified Veterinarian, this initiative is staffed for success.

If you currently have a program for sterilization of cats and/or dogs, describe your current level of funding and productivity and why additional resources are needed?

The Low-cost Spay/Neuter program of Suncoast Humane Society is in its infant stages. Currently we collaborate with Animal Rescue Coalition and pay the costs of using their mobile spay neuter service once a month. A recent grant has afforded us the opportunity to hire a full time veterinarian to move us towards a more comprehensive program. Additional resources are necessary to subsidize the surgery costs as well as additional promotional and administrative costs. The demand for this service is apparent in the fact that we currently have a waiting list of over 100, and this without a comprehensive promotional or marketing effort. We will continue to partner with Animal Rescue Coalition enabling us to take their mobile clinic into communities that have no access to affordable pet-sterilization surgeries and little resources for transportation. By making the services more accessible to those who need it most, we believe, we will have a greater impact in helping to reduce the pet overpopulation problems felt by our surrounding communities.

The above numbers have been estimated based on the fact that Suncoast Humane Society is in a unique situation in that it is based in a town which covers portions of three counties. The numbers were arrived at by taking 50% of Sarasota and Charlotte County.

Please explain what you believe are the most substantial sources of dog and cat overpopulation in the target area: The lack of affordable resources, coupled with the lack of education in resposible pet ownership is the greatest source of cat and dog overpopulation in the area.

What kinds of spay/neuter services are currently available in the target area and in what ways are these resources currently insufficient to meet community needs?

Outside of private veterinarian clinics, we are only aware of Animal Rescue Coalition offering any form of reduced cost pet sterilization services to the public in portions of our target area. Suncoast Humane Society has a service area of over 450 square miles and each year more than 4,000 animals are brought to the shelter. If all area animal shelters offered affordable spay & neuter services, it would still, unfortunately, be many years before the communities' needs are adequately met. The service area of Suncoast Humane Society does not interfere with the service area of Animal Rescue Coalition.

Florida Animal Friend is highly supportive of proposals that are focused on animal populations that are identified as substantial sources of dog or cat overpopulation rather than being diluted over too broad of a geographic area or diverse animal populations. Objectives

What do you hope to accomplish with these funds (objectives should be specific and quantifiable)?

The grant request will assist in funding the expansion of our spay/neuter program. It is anticipated that approximately 1,500 animals will be sterilized in the first year, with the amount increasing gradually to over 2,500 pet sterilization surgeries being performed by Suncoast humane Society each year. As it is unlikely for there to be a decreased need for these services in the foreseeable future, it is anticipated that Suncoast Humane Society will continue to expand the program in future years.

How does this program increase the number of sterilization surgeries above the existing baseline?

As this low-cost spay/neuter program is still in its first year, the initial increase from the existing baseline for will be 100%

Methods

What criteria will you use to determine eligibility for the program?

This is a need-based service and eligibility will be based on income, offering the services at a minimal cost (\$25)to residents at or below the 250% of the Federal Poverty Level. Proof of income is required.

How will you advertise the program? Explain how the advertising will reach the target audience.

Although currently the program has been filled to capacity with very little promotion, as we expand the program it will be advertised through a variety of media including radio, newspapers and distribution of flyers in local libraries, schools and clubs.

How will you address barriers to full use of the program such as transportation, illiteracy, and cultural hurdles?

Suncoast Humane Society has partnered with ARC to bring the mobile surgery unit into the areas that need the services most. In addition we have a van which, upon request, will be used to transport individual animals to a surgery location if the resident does not have access to transportation. Suncoast Humane Society has wonderful relations with area libraries which will assist if and when we are faced with illiteracy or cultural hurdles.

Does this project involve the transportation of animals by someone other than the client? If so, describe the vehicles, methods for confinement, personnel training, liability releases used to assure the safety of the animals and handlers.

Although it is expected that the transportation of the animals will 99% of the time be by the client, Suncoast Humane Society staff or trained volunteers may pick up animals from residents with disabilities and with no access to transportation. The vehicle is a 2006 Ford van which has been specially equipped for the transportation of animals. Staff and volunteers are thoroughly trained and are insured as drivers and covered under Suncoast Humane Society's liability insurance.

The low-cost spay neuter program charges a basic fee for anyone who qualifies based on their earnings at or below 250% of the Federal Poverty Level. The fees for the additional services are based on research of similar programs in a 100 mile radius, along with considering the economy and our own location.

There are numerous issues imposed on our community due to pet over population; primarily is the economic burden of providing humane care for lost, abandoned and nuisance animals. To this end, Suncoast Humane Society's recently introduced low-cost spay and neuter program is aimed at pet owners who have limited resources. Suncoast Humane Society has been fortunate to receive a grant from Gulf Coast Community Foundation of Venice. This grant has afforded us the opportunity to hire a full time contract veterinarian to perform low-cost sterilization surgeries at our shelter. Funds from this Florida Animal Friend grant request will primarily be for the medications and surgery supplies needed for the surgeries. Suncoast Humane Society, partnering with Animal Rescue Coalition, who have a mobile surgery unit, will perform off-site sterilization surgery. This outreach initiative will render this valued service more accessible to those residents in surrounding areas, especially North Port, who are either not capable or who cannot afford to travel to Suncoast Humane Society's premisis. As the program progesses, and funding is in place, we will continue

to assess the needs of the community and the best delivery of the program to all communities in our service area.

Describe any expenses that are not included in the grant and how they will be paid for:

This grant will cover the direct program cost of sterilization surgery. Additional costs will include: promotion and advertising expenses, vehicle costs, and administrative costs. These costs have been funded through separate sources which included the hiring of a full-time veterinarian and support vet-tech.

Timeline

All projects must be completed within 12 months of receipt of funding. Any unexpended funds must be refunded to Florida Animal Friend within 30 days of the end of the project. Requests for time extensions must be made in writing at least 30 days prior to the end of the project. Funding for accepted projects will be available after August 1, 2009.
