SGI Cat Allies has held many successful mass TNVR events hosted by our areas only Veterinarian Dr. Hobson Fulmer. However, our services remain in high demand. Operation Nip it in the Bud was designed to increase our effectiveness by utilizing alternate resources. Operation Spay Bay located in Panama City, FL has agreed to S/N 10-20 cats on a weekly basis with a target goal of 300 community cats. Cathy Buell, President of SGI Cat Allies will spearhead this project. She has effectively been lead administrator for our mass TNVR events. As a former Educator, Ms. Buell brings a myriad of skills and network contacts required to implement this program. She will be working directly with Terry Cotter of Operation Spay Bay 850-215-1022

If you currently have a program for sterilization of cats and/or dogs, describe your current level of funding and productivity and why additional resources are needed?

SGI Cat Allies has TNVR 556 community cats in the past 2 1/2 years. As a public charity, all of our funding to date has been through private donation and fundraisers. Over population of community cats mandates an increase in our program. Current fundraisers include hot dog sales at local events and six donation jars located in area businesses. For 2017, we are increasing our efforts by initiating a direct mail solicitation, a spayghetti dinner with silent auction, and application to available grants.

In this small area, neighbors frequently just call those they know are volunteers. A weekly trapping list is compiled on a first come first serve basis. We are open to prioritizing according to reported colony size.

Describe whether the targeted area is rural, suburban, or urban. Is it commercial, residential, agricultural, or a designated special land use?

Apalachicola, Eastpoint, and St. George Island are small rural bayside communities separated only by two bridges. We answer all request both residential and commercial within this 10 mile radius.

For TNR program, describe the ability to maintain lifelong care for remaining cats, commitment level of volunteers/organizations, etc.

There are an abundance of retirees in the area that enjoy providing for the colonies. However, financially it poses a problem to feed the colonies for many. This month we have established a food bank to assist these caretakers. Volunteer Angela Shields is spearheading this effort. Many local businesses from Restaurants to Realty Offices maintain and support several colonies. It is a very animal friendly community.

In addition to reducing by attrition the number of free roaming cats, we offer colony relocation services to community cats that may be a threat to nesting birds or other wildlife.

Describe efforts that will be made to mitigate current or potential nuisance issues.

We consistently educate our citizens in the benefits of TNVR. Humanely reducing the numbers of free-roaming cats benefits the felines and the residents. As we are able to reduce the number of unwanted litters, the incident of nuisance issues also reduces. We also have experience in relocating colonies as a last resort.

Door-to-door canvassing helps to identify colonies and provides a limitless opportunity to educate individuals, as well as groups, regarding the efficiency of TNVR programs. Locating the cats and trapping the cats are our responsibility. Our volunteer base is consistently increasing to accommodate the additional trapping.

Objectives

What do you hope to accomplish with these funds (objectives should be specific and quantifiable)?

Right now we are reducing our reproductive cat population by appoximately 250 cats annually. With this grant we would like to sustain our current level plus an additional 300 surgeries. The increased community contact also provides an excellent opportunity to educate the local and visiting population as well as informing them about Florida Animal Friends.

How does this program increase the number of sterilization surgeries above the existing baseline?

We will sustain our current level of approximately 250 surgeries per year. Given a time frame of 9-15-17 to 9-15-18 it would effectively increase our numbers to approximately 400 cats sterilized annually for 2017 and 2018.

Methods

What criteria will you use to determine eligibility for your program?

All intact feral or community cats, at least three months old weighing at least 3 pounds, are eligible for our program.

How will you advertise the program? Explain how the advertising will reach the target audience. Apalach Times, Oyster Radio, SGI Cat Allies Facebook page, SGIcatallies.com web page, civic meetings, fundraisers, and direct mail, Flyers in local grocery stores and other area businesses.

How will you address barriers to full use of the program such as transportation, illiteracy, and cultural hurdles?

Cats will be trapped by SGI Cat Allies volunteers and housed in a secure environment. They will then be transported to Panama City by Operation Spay Bay in their 'Neuter Commuter" climate controlled cargo van and returned to us. Before we trap, we require the property owners signature on a permission form. It is during this interaction that we have the opportunity to educate citizens regarding the many benefits of TNVR.

Does this project involve the transportation of animals by someone other than the client? If so, describe the vehicles, methods for confinement, personnel training, liability releases used to assure the safety of the animals and handlers.

Trapping is lead by Cathy Buell. All volunteers are given a 4 hour training in appropriate protocol, including safety issues for both cat and volunteer. All volunteers sign a liability waiver kept on file at SGI Cat Allies. Once the cats are trapped a cover is placed over the trap to help keep them calm and they are held in a secure environment until pick-up by Operation Spay Bay driver Amy Wetzel.

Veterinary Services

What arrangements have you made with veterinarians to perform the surgeries?

Operation Spay Bay has two Vets on staff. We are charged an average of \$40 for surgery plus \$10 for Rabies vaccine per cat.

We have been fortunate enough to have recently added to our list of volunteers. Andy Bass formerly with RedRover, Florida State Animal Rescue Coalition, and currently with the ASPCA of Tampa, FL, has moved to the area and has already become very active with us. Also, Bonnie Stewart has moved here from Oconee County Georgia where she was head of Dog Adoptions with her local Humane Society. That is just to name a couple of our trained/experienced volunteers that stand ready to assist in trapping to facilitate the ongoing success of our operation. We have purchased 25 TruCatch traps and made covers for them. Operation Spay Bay provides us with the opportunity to make St. George Island/Apalachicola. Eastpoint a model success story for TNVR. Positive support through volunteering to donations from our Community and Vacationers has been outstanding.
