ACT's primary mission is to educate and assist our community in preventing the over population of unwanted cats and dogs. Our programming is especially important this year as across the nation we are seeing larger numbers of pets abandoned and unnecessary pet euthanizing. Spay the Bay is a year-round program that allows large numbers of spay and neuters to be performed for only \$10 per pet and includes the administration of the core vaccines essential in preventing parvovirus, distemper in dogs, panleukopenia in cats and rabies. Act's clinic is prepped for high volume of spay and neuters as well as life- essential services. Development Director, Samantha Polk, heads up our commitment by encouraging this program in Tampa Bay and surrounding areas. Focusing on maintaining the access to ACT services to a largely diverse and underserved population through partnerships, grants and maintaining donor relations. Our founding program, SpayDay, held on 2nd Monday of each month, sterilizes from 75-110 ferals. ACT has successfully completed thousands of feral cat surgeries for \$10 per cat including Ear tip, distemper and rabies vaccines and necessary medical issues are treated at the time of spay/neuter. SpayDay is the brainchild of ACT's Executive Director and Founder, Linda Hamilton.

If you currently have a program for sterilization of cats and/or dogs, describe your current level of funding and productivity and why additional resources are needed?

ACT's pricing structure is set to cover regular operating expenses. ACT's outreach program, SpayDay, is supplemented with budgeted funds and community partnerships. With the development of our Spay the Bay program ACT is able to extend the opportunity for pets to be spay/ neutered as well as receive rabies and distemper vaccines for just \$10 all year long. Additional funding for Spay the Bay and programs like SpayDay comes from grants, sponsorship and fundraising. While the success of SpayDay has always been a highlight of ACT's, it is not enough. Spay the Bay is a year-round program focused on reducing over population and meeting the pet needs of low-income households in our area. 30% of pet owners do not annually bring their pets to the vet visits. This leaves our community's pets vulnerable to vaccine-preventable diseases and extreme number growth in over population. ACT has the ability to preform 30 surgeries and 30 wellness appointments daily. Initiating Spay the Bay will make is possible for ACT to remain at high volume numbers, reduce over population and allows thousands of pets to live healthy and happy lives.

Our targeted area is Hillsborough County, FL and it includes 1,020 square miles.

What is the criteria used for determining the target area(s) and/or eligibility for this program?

Hillsborough County residences who trap a cat are eligible for Spay the Bay. These community cats will have their ear tipped during the spay/neuter surgery as well as receive pain medication and rabies and panleukopania vaccines.

Describe whether the targeted area is rural, suburban, or urban. Is it commercial, residential, agricultural, or a designated special land use?

Hillsborough County includes urban area's within the Tampa city limits, suburban area's surrounding the city as well as a large rural area. Free roaming community cats as well as feral cats live in all three types of areas.

Cats trapped for this program will have caregivers which are already caring for the cats. These caregivers include individuals and dedicated volunteer rescue groups.

Do current city/county ordinances address TNR or free-roaming cats?

County ordinance states that feral cats are required to have adequate food and water. Caregivers must provide proof of vaccines. Tags are not required. This is consistent with the spay/neuter packages we are providing in this program.

TNR is supported by many local volunteer groups in our area. Primary supporters include ACT, HSTB, South Shore Felines, Feline Folks, St. Francis Animal Rescue, and Cat Crusaders.

Describe any effort to lessen the negative impact on local wildlife.

Properly managed colonies have low negative impact on local wildlife. Cats that are fed on a regular basis are less likely to hunt local wildlife for food. This program allows what has become one of the most invasive species, cats, to live healthy lives with proper care.

Describe efforts that will be made to mitigate current or potential nuisance issues.

Spay The Bay's ability to provide educational information to caregivers which keeps colonies healthy by providing affordable vaccines and wellness care as needed.

Trapped cats will be brought to ACT by caregivers. These animals are checked into our clinic and given a pre surgical exam by the veterinarian. Any wounds or other health issues will be noted and treatment recommendations given to caregivers. TNR cats healthy and old enough for surgery will be spay/neutered, ears will be tipped and vaccines administered.

Objectives

What do you hope to accomplish with these funds (objectives should be specific and quantifiable)?

Our objective is to give Hillsborough County the educational resources to spay/neuter their pets as well as vaccinate annually. We expect to sterilize an additional 650 free roaming and feral cats in this program. With our current statistical information, we expect 52% of the cats will be female and 48% will be males. The grant will pay for the surgical costs, the client's \$10 payment will cover the cost of the rabies vaccine, distemper vaccine, dewormer, and pain injection. Overhead costs will be absorbed by ACT.

How does this program increase the number of sterilization surgeries above the existing baseline?

The Spay The Bay program will increase our spay/ neuter surgeries by 100 to 120 feral, community and owned cats per month.

Methods

What criteria will you use to determine eligibility for your program?

All cats must be in a trap and then are registered for the \$10 program with Spay The Bay. They will be ear tipped and vaccinated as well sterilized.

How will you advertise the program? Explain how the advertising will reach the target audience.

ACT has been established as a leading nonprofit veterinary clinic in the Tampa Bay community for over 20 years. Our compassionate programming extends deep throughout the area. We also have a strong social media presence with over 11,000 Facebook followers and we send over 25,700 email blasts keeping our community up to date on all ACT's programming and opportunities.

How will you address barriers to full use of the program such as transportation, illiteracy, and cultural hurdles?

ACT provides informational programming distribution in Spanish as well as English. We also have several bilingual staff members on both our administration department and medical teams.

Does this project involve the transportation of animals by someone other than the client? If so, describe the vehicles, methods for confinement, personnel training, liability releases used to assure the safety of the animals and handlers.

ACT has a van "Neuter Scooter" which is available to pickup of cats and dogs. We plan to expand the usage of that van to pick up large numbers of traps for our Spay The Bay program. We are fully licensed for animal pickup and selected ACT employees are covered for driving responsibilities.

Veterinary Services

ACT's clinic has three fulltime veterinarians and full surgical staff members. Our surgical room is fully prepped with multiple surgical tables to accommodate the high volume of surgeries we preform. ACT also have a program which allows certified veterinarians the ability to earn their needed surgical hours.

\$10 fee includes all required services including rabies, pain medicine, parasite medication (including earmites and parasites) ear tipping and (other) antibiotic and distemper. Antibiotic for ferals was an agreement within our vet community and distemper was requested by the county when they approved the practice of TNVR in the county.

We take our commitments seriously and we expect the best from those in the position to make positive changes for the animals. We are being extremely conservative with our promises and requests for this grant funding request.

Additional expenses include ear tipping, antibiotics & distemper vaccines; ACT's partners and client will absorb cost with copay.

Client will supplement cost with \$10 copay. Foundation Partners also provide funding which allow additional vaccines. Any unforeseen issues will be absorbed by ACT and the caregiver will have the opportunity to donate to that service.

We will factor this year long Spay the Bay program into the next budget after the grant is completed, as we did SpayDay and the Community Cat special pricing. Future funding sources include fees from fundraising event activities, sponsorships, grants, foundation partners, donations, payments by caregivers and other opportunities.
