Our current leadership is provided by the Board of Directors, our Clinic Manager, Jessica Hendrix, and our Medical Director, Dr. Alicia Bays, D.V.M.. Each board member is affiliated with a local animal rescue organization and will aid in disseminating information about our program. Dr. Bays has been working since the start of the clinic to ensure medical protocols meet national standards set by the Humane Alliance located in North Carolina.

If you currently have a program for sterilization of cats and/or dogs, describe your current level of funding and productivity and why additional resources are needed?

We have the ability to carry out this program through the dedication and skills of our team. We regularly perform 40-50 safe surgeries daily and have often surpassed our average numbers to meet demand for other grants up to 80-100 surgeries/day. We have also recently hired another full-time veterinarian to help with surgeries and well as wellness. We use paid trained staff in the clinic. We do not allow volunteers to handle animals but volunteers are welcomed with help with phone calls and cleaning assistance such as laundry.

Operation Spay Bay is the only low cost spay and neuter clinic in the area and our goal is to reduce pet overpopulation and achieve no kill status in our own and surrounding counties. We have surgery days four days a week all year round.

We believe the numbers of pets in our area to be higher. We have recently completed over 70,000 spay and neuters after 8 years. we are not nearly the only veterinary hospital in the area and there are still lots of unfixed animals out there.	
Please explain what you believe are the most substantial sources of dog and cat overpopulation in the target area:	
One of the most substantial sources of dog and cat overpopulation in the area are all the residents with big hearts and small pockets. Many of our clients tell stories of taking in stray animals that they cannot stand to see suffer but then find that they can provide little more than some food for them. There are many misconceptions such as females should have at least one litter to enjoy the "joys of motherhood" before being spayed and that it is safer for the pet if they are at least one year old at the time of surgery, by which time they've probably already had a litter. Don't forget - brothers and sisters won't have a baby together! We are working to educate people that their kittens can get pregnant at 4-5 months of age. We also have a local air force and navy base and unfortunately many pets are left behind with military transfers.	
What kinds of spay/neuter services are currently available in the target area and in what ways are these resources currently insufficient to meet community needs?	
Currently, we are the only low cost spay neuter clinic within 75 miles. All of the other veterinary services are through private practice and thus their fees are significantly higher than what most Bay County residents can comfortably afford. The average cost for spay/neuter in Bay County is \$310 while our average cost is \$75. We recently hired another full time veterinarian to help as we have been booking out two months in advance.

Objectives

What do you hope to accomplish with these funds (objectives should be specific and quantifiable)?

We want to target community cats. These are the kitties roaming around outdoors that are most likely to be contributing to cat overpopulation. With \$25,000 we can fix and administer rabies vaccine to 440 cats. We would include a pain injection at the time of surgery, an antibiotic injection at time of surgery to all females and any males with medical conditions, as well as subcutaneous fluids to any cats in medical need of it. We would also require an ear tip in order for a cat to receive this grant. This will keep the target population to community cats as many pet owners do not like seeing ear tips on their personal cats.

How does this program increase the number of sterilization surgeries above the existing baseline?

This program will help get cats into our clinic that people would otherwise not be able to afford or consider fixing as the cats "are not their cats". By promoting community cats and ear tips we can encourage more people to take care of cats in their neighborhood and understand the significance of an ear tip in demonstrating that a cat has already been fixed.

Methods

What criteria will you use to determine eligibility for your program?

We will accept any cat that is designated a community cat/ stray/ or feral. We will require ear tips on all cats to reduce the number of pet cats being slipped in but as our goal is to reduce pet overpopulation we do not want to discourage cats from coming in.

How will you advertise the program? Explain how the advertising will reach the target audience.

We have a large facebook audience that will spread any grants that we have available. We also work with numerous trappers and rescue organizations that can spread the word to those they know that need help. Also, we will notify local media. The local news will come out and promote our campaign.

How will you address barriers to full use of the program such as transportation, illiteracy, and cultural hurdles?

We have a transport van that can pick up cats locally as well as several rescues that will organize cats together. By removing the cost barrier, this program will help those that don't want to spend money on a stray animal. As much of our grants are spread by word of mouth, we hope illiteracy will not be too much of a barrier.

We have a transport van (a small modified cargo) that can pick up animals. All cats must be in secure individual carriers or traps before being placed in our van.

We have provided mass community cat grants before. To accommodate people and scheduling we will allow drop offs early in the week without appointments. As we are targeting the feral/stray population, appointments are not helpful since you have no idea if you can catch the cat in the first place. If we have too many cats to fix in a day then we house and feed them and fix them the next day. If truly overwhelmed (150+ cats show up in one day) then we can get help from an additional veterinarian and work overtime to get those kitties fixed.

We will continue to solicit donations. Last year 198 cat surgeries were fully funded through our Operation Spay Bay TNR program. These were all local donations. Many times per year we are able to offer discounted community cat days depending on veterinarian availability where we offer discounted spay/neuter, rabies, and ear tip for feral and community cats. We will also continue to apply for more grants.
