# Give additional background information on your organization's programs as they relate to this application and the qualifications of the personnel who will be in charge of this program. Show that you have the capacity to carry out this program.

PURRR was founded in 2018 as a non-profit feline sanctuary. Based on the number of intakes and wanting to help the community, PURRR started a high-volume spay/neuter clinic to help with overpopulation. Our clinic started in June of 2021 and has become one of only a few organizations in Broward County to perform low-cost S/N services. We have grown the number of cats we sterilized year over year significantly. We hired a new Executive Director and one of the main priorities was to grow our S/N clinic. We doubled the number of surgeries from 1H22 to 2H22 and recently leased a new building to be able to increase the number of days we perform surgeries. We have established relationships throughout the county with trappers, rescues and other organizations all working towards a common goal of helping to control the community cat population.

PURRR offers low cost, high quality, high-volume spay/neuter services. PURRR believes that collaboration is key to making an impact and have developed partnerships throughout the community to address the overpopulation of cats. We work with the public, trappers and other rescue organizations. PURRR offers additionally reduced fees to those that are focused on community cats/TNR.

### Please explain if you believe your target area animal population is significantly different than above.

Feedback from the community is that the cat population is the worst it has ever been and believe that the free-roaming/community animal population is significantly more than above.

### Please explain what you believe are the most substantial sources of dog and cat overpopulation in the target area:

The most substantial reason for feline overpopulation is lack of affordable/low-cost and high-volume S/N services. Additionally, there is a challenge in management of feral/free-roaming cats within the county. The other ancillary factors are lack of education in the community on the importance of spay/neuter and community support at the county level.

What kinds of spay/neuter services are currently available in the target area and in what ways are these resources currently insufficient to meet community needs?

There are very limited resources for spay/neuter services throughout South Florida, especially in Broward County. The Broward County Shelter does very few S/N surgeries and vouchers are limited. The Broward County Humane Society has paused their S/N services. The feline population is exploding, the demand greatly exceeds the resources available.
Florida Animal Friend is highly supportive of proposals that are focused on animal populations that are identified as substantial sources of dog or cat overpopulation rather than being diluted over too broad of a geographic area or diverse animal populations. # Objectives

#### What do you hope to accomplish with these funds (objectives should be specific and quantifiable)?

The funds from Florida Animal Friend will allow us to provide additional low-cost spay/neuter services for TNR in the effort to help decrease the population of community cats. The money will provide S/N services for 500 feral/community cats. The program will not stop after the grant money has been depleted: we will apply for additional funding through donors and fundraising efforts.

#### How does this program increase the number of sterilization surgeries above the existing baseline?

In 2022, we spayed/neutered a total of 2,828 cats. The majority were community cats and over half were TNVR/ear-tipped. Your support will help us increase the TNVR numbers during the grant period of 12 months. With your assistance, we can spay/neuter more cats, with a goal of 4,250 for the 12-month grant period. PLEASE NOTE: We paused our S/N services in mid-January as our lease expired and we are moving to new location. New location to open on or before 5/1/23. Goal would be based on grant period of 9/1/23-8/31/24.

#### Methods

#### What criteria will you use to determine eligibility for your program?

To avoid providing free spay/neuter surgeries for owned cats or cats being adopted though rescues, we will require that all cats be ear tipped to participate in this TNR/RTF program. We will be working with trappers that focus on specific colonies for the greatest impact.

#### How will you advertise the program? Explain how the advertising will reach the target audience.

We are moving into a new location that has high visibility and is more accessible to the target population. We will continue to work with community partners and the network of trappers and other organizations to get the word out. We have a reputation in the community and have a waiting list of over 100+.

#### How will you address barriers to full use of the program such as transportation, illiteracy, and cultural hurdles?

To address the barriers to full use of the program, we will work with community partners to help with transportation and education, cross-culturally.

We follow low-cost, high-volume S/N protocol. All cats receive pain medication and antibiotics during surgery. Clients have the option to include additional vaccines and/or microchips at their expense.

The grant would cover surgery and rabies for 500 community/TNR cats. There is no additional charge for ear notch. We charge the client/organization for other vaccines and microchipping.

# Describe any other funding sources for this program, i.e. other grants, targeted fundraising efforts, budget allocation, etc.

This is the first time applying for the Florida Animal Friend Grant and we would like to keep it as a stand alone program. 500 S/N surgeries dedicated to TNR/community cats only. We will continue with our regular S/N services outside of this grant.
