Animal Welfare Society of South Florida(AWS) was founded in 1972 as a low cost spay/neuter clinic. Over the next 50 years, it grew into a full-service hospital. Our veterinary staff consists of five part-time doctors along with ten veterinary technicians, two pharmacy/lab technicians, two receptionists and a hospital manager. Our active client listing is over 32,000 with an average daily client count of 18 per day. We have digital radiograph equipment and in clinic blood processing capability. Our veterinarians have a total of forty years experience, with our senior vet Dr. Joy Carter overseeing the program. Our hospital is staffed 24/7 with a Vet tech in ICU. AWS is open six days a week and perform spay/neuter surgeries Monday-Friday. If needed, we perform surgeries on Saturdays.

Objectives

What do you hope to accomplish with these funds (objectives should be specific and quantifiable)?

With the FAF funds, it is our hope to significantly add to our Community Outreach Spay/Neuter program. Our goal is to provide 275 sterilization surgeries for cats and 145 sterilizations for dogs belonging to low -income or financially constrained qualified residents of Miami. We know by spaying and neutering we will help reduce the number of unwanted litters adding to the overpopulation crisis overwhelming Miami Dade County.

How does this program increase the number of sterilization surgeries above the existing baseline?

This grant will allow us increase surgeries above the baseline which is currently 100 for cats and 55 for dogs. We know there are both AWS clients and Miami residents that due to financial issues, are unable to obtain the spay or neuter surgery for their pets.

Methods

What criteria will you use to determine eligibility for your program?

The criteria for eligibility for our program will be determined upon the pet owner providing proof of financial constraint (U.S. Poverty guidelines) or participation in government assisted programs including Medicaid, Reemployment Assistance, Aid for Dependent Children, Jackson Memorial Hospital Clinic Cards.

How will you advertise the program? Explain how the advertising will reach the target audience.

Advertising will be promoted in Spanish, English and Creole at our hospital, social media, local pet friendly events, City of Miami NET (Neighborhood Enhancement Team and hopefully with local TV Animal Advocate programs.

How will you address barriers to full use of the program such as transportation, illiteracy, and cultural hurdles?

We will address promotional barriers by having all materials about the program prepared in English, Spanish and Creole. Person to person contact through community outreach will cover illiteracy concerns. The pet owners will have to provide their own transportation.

Because the target population includes the people we see every day, we know the community, their financial hardships and understand the need for free sterilization. The need continues to be great and now more than ever with the still increasing inflation and escalating cost of living in Miami and its financial impact on so many pet owners. The additional funds will allow us to continue and expand this mission. We are seeing more and more loving pet owners, now struggling to make ends meets with rising prices on everything from gas to rent to food. Many are having difficulty buying pet food so spaying or neutering is not a priority. In closing, we are confident this grant will help us help perform these vital sterilizations to the struggling families along with those in the neighborhoods we wish to target.

AWS staff veterinarians will be paid our of the annual budget. Antibiotics, medical supplies (including syringes, e-collars) ear tipping, testing, vaccines (other than rabies) and basic examinations will be included.

AWS is fortunate, two of larger supporters, are committed to supporting our spay/neuter program and we will use a portion of their donations when needed.

AWS began as a spay/neuter clinic in 1972 and continues to be committed to solving the pet overpopulation crisis in Miami-Dade County. We budgeted \$6,000 for the first six months of 2024 to maintain our Community Outreach Spay/Neuter Program. Donations and fundraisers fuel this program. AWS is adding a dedicated Development Manager who will assist in the fulfillment of this program.
