We have a transport spay/neuter program that targets TNR for cats and lower costs spay/neuter services for low-income folks. We have developed a website this year for the public to fill out spay/neuter requests and we have a phone number for folks to call for spay/neuter help. We have trained volunteers and staff to schedule services. We have successfully established to run smooth for the past 7 years and we increase our spay/neuter services each year!

We currently have a very successful spay/neuter program. This year we launched a new website (www.catsangels.org) for people to fill out information and requests for spay/neuter services and TNR. We also purchased a new van to help transport and TNR and pet cats. Our program has trained staff and volunteers that have ran the program successfully over the past 7 years. This involves returning phone call, follow ups, scheduling, trapping education, setting up and caring for TNR cats also. **Number of animals sterilized in that program in the past year: Cats:** 1011 **Dogs:** 1

## Please explain what you believe are the most substantial sources of dog and cat overpopulation in the target area:

Currently, we have a lot of rural areas in Nassau County with no access to veterinary services and funding.

What kinds of spay/neuter services are currently available in the target area and in what ways are these resources currently insufficient to meet community needs?

7 veterinary clinics in Nassau County. Most charge \$300-\$500 per pet for spay/neuter services. If you have 5 stray cats that you are feeding, it would cost you 1,000 to neuter them. Also, most clinics don't accept feral cats and only do 3 to 4 surgeries a day.

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## Objectives

#### What do you hope to accomplish with these funds (objectives should be specific and quantifiable)?

Our goal is to spay/neuter 1,500 cats in our community. This would help us achieve our overall goal of spay/neutering over 1,000 cats this year. We also want to continue to keep our shelters in Nassau stay no-kill. Knowing that we will have more than 35,000 new homes built soon, we want to increase our spay/neuter volume to keep up with the growth.

#### How does this program increase the number of sterilization surgeries above the existing baseline?

Last year, we increased our spay/neuter program from 800 cats to 1000 cats. If we were granted more funding, we could help over 1,500 cats in community.

## Methods

#### What criteria will you use to determine eligibility for your program?

The locations to be serviced by this grant are for vicinities in the Northeast of Nassau County, Hilliard, Callahan, Briceville, and one area in Fernandina Beach located off Old Nassauville Rd. The target areas are rural residential communities with some commercial development. The targeted areas include predominantly low-income households that do not have access to affordable spay/neuter support from any provider other than Cats Angels, Inc. Also, the number of requests received by Cats Angels from residents and business owners in these areas requesting spay/neuter control of feral and community cat populations.

#### How will you advertise the program? Explain how the advertising will reach the target audience.

We will advertise on social media, our website, and local newspapers. Also, we will make flyers for the program and post these in our community(Animal services, FCNHP, Humane Society, Grocery Stores, and food banks).

#### How will you address barriers to full use of the program such as transportation, illiteracy, and cultural hurdles?

We provide traps, transportation, carriers, and food. We also provide written material in Spanish

# Does this project involve the transportation of animals by someone other than the client? If so, describe the vehicles, methods for confinement, personnel training, liability releases used to assure the safety of the animals and handlers.

Cats Angels has a dedicated van that is used in trapping and transporting cats from the trapping site to surgery. We have each owner sign a liability waver when we transport their cats. Cats Angels offers volunteer trapping classes to the public, volunteers, and animal control. Cats Angels also has a dedicated room that is specifically designed with climate control to care for cats pre and post surgery recovery.

## Veterinary Services

#### What arrangements have you made with veterinarians to perform the surgeries?

First Coast No more Homless Pets reserves every Wednesday for us to bring in 25 or more animals in for spay/neuter services. We also have a voucher program for people to bring the animals in at their convenience.



## Other Information

#### Provide any additional information that will help the grant selection committee understand how the program will operate to achieve its goals.

We are an organization that has been in existence for 22 years and has helped spay/neuter 20,000 cats. We take TNR and low-cost spay/neuter seriously. Our call volume consists of 25 to 30 people calling each week for spay/neuter each week. Once the need is established, we have a team of trained volunteers that help trap the cats and bring them to Cats Angels. If the cats are pets, we verify their low-income eligibility. Next, we have a scheduled dedicated day that we bring them to First Coast No More Homeless Pets in our dedicated van. Lastly, once they are spay/neutered the feral cats recover at Cats Angels before being released.

We have a thrift store that funds our programs and we have 2 fundraisers throughout the year to supplement our costs

We have two big fundraisers each year and together they raise about \$11,000. We have a thrift store that generates about half of our funding each year. We also have quarterly newsletters, and an end of year appeal letter that generates the remainder of our budget.
