Founded in 1952, the Humane Society of Sarasota County (HSSC) is Sarasota's oldest animal welfare organization. In 2009, HSSC became a no-kill shelter and in 2021 we completed a 38,000 sq. ft. new facility that doubled our capacity for care. At the heart of our mission is the core belief that every animal is cared for and loved. Since 2016, HSSC has operated a public Animal Clinic that provides affordable wellness and preventative veterinary care to the community. HSSC employs 4 fulltime Florida licensed DVMs that provided for the veterinary care of animals in our shelter as well as treat owned animals. Additionally, HSSC offers veterinary services to local TNVR groups, rescues and shelters. Veterinary services offered include wellness care and vaccines, spay/neuter, geriatric care, heartworm treatment, laser therapy, endoscopy, dentistry, in-house diagnostics and radiographs, and general surgery. At our main campus, HSSC has a shelter medical wing, with surgery suite and dental island, that services our shelter animals and offers drop off service for TNVR groups, shelters and rescues. Separately, our public Animal Clinic has its own surgery suite, exam rooms, and dental island for owned pets.

HSSC offers low cost s/n services to the public and when funding is available we offer no cost s/n services to TNVR groups, shelters and rescues. Below, HSSC is providing the total number of community TNVR surgeries performed by our DVMS in 2023, Cats and dogs combined, owned and shelter, HSSC performed more than 3.300 spay/neuter surgeries in 2023.

Please explain what you believe are the most substantial sources of dog and cat overpopulation in the target area: The majority of their cat intakes are the result of nuisance complaints from too many outdoor cats in residential areas. Targeted s/n of outdoor community cats would prevent many of these nuisance complaints and result in a reduction of unnecessary euthanasia's from being performed.
What kinds of spay/neuter services are currently available in the target area and in what ways are these resources currently insufficient to meet community needs?
There are very limited agencies offering spay neuter surgeries for community cats in Sarasota County. The Animal rescue Coalition performs limited procedures on community cats due to their offering spay neuter procedures to owned cats located both in Sarasota and Manatee Counties.
Florida Animal Friend is highly supportive of proposals that are focused on animal populations that are identified as substantial sources of dog or cat overpopulation rather than being diluted over too broad of a geographic area or diverse animal populations. Objectives

What do you hope to accomplish with these funds (objectives should be specific and quantifiable)?

The target goal is 300 sterilizations of community cats in Sarasota County to prevent them from being trapped, housed at the municipal shelter and euthanized at the end of their stray hold period. Sarasota County Animal Services euthanized over 200 cats in FY2023 due to their being unadoptable due to behavior and temperament.

How does this program increase the number of sterilization surgeries above the existing baseline?

We had increased our goal to perform 1000 spay and neuter procedures based on our ability in 2023 to complete 700 community cat procedures at the shelter medical dept.

Methods

Cats being admitted into the program using grant funds will be pre-screened by community cat organizations alongside Sarasota County Animal Services data base and activity reports.

HSSC has an inhouse Marketing Dept that promotes all of our programs & services. HSSC already offers a variety of programs to under-served members of our community. Our Pet Food Pantry, for example. We have 70 years of experience successfully addressing barriers to programs

The community cats will be transported in humane traps using Animal Control Vehicles, trapping organizations vehicles and The Humane Society of Sarasota County marked vehicles.
