The funds will go towards a spay and neuter voucher program for low-income households. Partnering high volume clinics are located throughout the local area and increase the availability and convenience for pet owners.

The voucher program currently issues 50 dog and 50 cat vouchers at the beginning of each month. Qualifying pet owners must fall into the 200% of the Federal Poverty line. There are multiple clinics to choose from to receive services.

What kinds of spay/neuter services are currently available in the target area and in what ways are these resources currently insufficient to meet community needs?

Many of the private practice vets do not offer low-cost options for sterilization. While pet owners may be able to get affordable vaccinations or wellness visits, the surgeries can exceed personal resources.

Florida Animal Friend is highly supportive of proposals that are focused on animal populations that are identified as substantial sources of dog or cat overpopulation rather than being diluted over too broad of a geographic area or diverse animal populations. Objectives

What do you hope to accomplish with these funds (objectives should be specific and quantifiable)?

Grant funds will be issued to qualifying low-income residents for vouchers for partnering clinics. Residents can qualify for up to two pets per household per a calendar year. We plan to fund at least 170 dogs surgeries and 170 cat surgeries using grant funds. Long term we would ideally reduce intakes by reducing unexpected litters. Remainder of youchers will be funded through the county's general fund.

How does this program increase the number of sterilization surgeries above the existing baseline?

Last year we received 973 voucher applications. Of those, 264 cats and 195 dogs received services. In our feedback surveys, most pet owners stated they could not have afforded the surgeries without a voucher.

Methods

What criteria will you use to determine eligibility for your program?

Applicants must be Orange County residents and have an income less than 200% of the federal poverty level or receive federal or state benefits.

How will you advertise the program? Explain how the advertising will reach the target audience.

Orange County Animal Services updates their website monthly when the voucher application portal is available. There is a direct link for the public to access there. Social media sites are also an effective way to raise awareness of the program.

How will you address barriers to full use of the program such as transportation, illiteracy, and cultural hurdles?

Call center staff as well as shelter staff can assist residents who have difficulty completing the application. The three partnering clinics are located in opposite ends of the region for ease of access to the community.

Does this project involve the transportation of animals by someone other than the client? If so, describe the vehicles, methods for confinement, personnel training, liability releases used to assure the safety of the animals and handlers.

At this time, we do not transport any animals for the voucher program.

Vouchers are provided to qualifying residents who request them on a first come, first served basis each month. Applicants are unable to apply for future vouchers without claiming previously approved vouchers.

For your voucher program, how have you determined the capacity of the veterinarians listed above to handle the projected capacity?

The program has been established for approximately four years. We periodically check with the clinics to see the waitlist for surgeries. Ideally, clients should be seen within a few months to avoid potential of unsterilized pets getting impregnated while waiting for surgery.
