Apalachicola Bay Animal Clinic is the only veterinary hospital in Franklin County. They have hosted 6 high volume, low cost, spay/neuter events in the past nine years, but are not staffed to offer low-cost spay/neuter on a regular basis to locals.

To provide funding to help TNVR 250 cats in the coming year.

By paying directly for the spay/neuter of community cats.

Any free-roaming community cat cared for by a resident of the three municipalities listed above.

Social media, local radio station WOYS 100.5 We also participate in local festivals, advertising our program.

How will you address barriers to full use of the program such as transportation, illiteracy, and cultural hurdles?

We own a minivan, and provide trapping and transportation to and from trapping site. Operation Spay Bay in Panama City provides transportation from our temporary shelter in Apalachicola to and from Panama City. The illiteracy and cultural hurdles are addressed by our past success. Local caregivers who have benefited from our service often times convince friends /neighbors of the importance of TNR.

Does this project involve the transportation of animals by someone other than the client? If so, describe the vehicles, methods for confinement, personnel training, liability releases used to assure the safety of the animals and handlers.

1. 2006 Honda minivan, serves as our transport vehicle to and from trap site and our temporary shelter. 2. The city of Apalachicola has granted us use of a climate controlled classroom in a former high school building. Typically, cats are confined and cared for the night they are trapped, and then picked up by operation Spay Bay the next morning for surgery. We then care for the confined cats, post surgery, and return them to their caregiver property the following day.. Our TNVR protocols strictly follow Operation Catnip, Gainesville program. All volunteers are supervised by the two most senior members of our team, sharing 30 years of experience in animal welfare.
