Give additional background information on your organization's programs as they relate to this application and the qualifications of the personnel who will be in charge of this program. Show that you have the capacity to carry out this program.

In early 2024 our rescue opened the only low-cost spay/neuter clinic in Okaloosa, Santa Rosa, Walton and Escambia Counties. We have received tremendous community support and are fully staffed both in the clinic and the rescue. We have one full-time high-volume specialist veterinarian and two part-time veterinarians committed to the clinic. The clinic is housed in one of our rescue facilities which is staffed with full-time employees, including our rescue president. Our veterinarian has years of experience in one of Florida's highest volume spay/neuter clinic, and is widely regarded as one of the best (and fastest) high-volume surgeons. Our rescue president has 14 years of shelter and rescue experience, and has coordinated a spay/neuter transport program since 2017. We also have a key staff member who previously managed a local shelter.

In early 2024 we opened our low-cost spay/neuter clinic in Baker, Florida (Okaloosa County). We spay, neuter and vaccinate dogs, pet cats, feral cats and even rats. We are able to sterilize at least 200 animals per week.

Other than retail vets, the nearest low-cost spay/neuter facilities are in Panama City, FL, Dothan, AL and Mobile, AL. All at least 90 minutes from our target area. And these facilities are booked out months in advance.

## Objectives

#### What do you hope to accomplish with these funds (objectives should be specific and quantifiable)?

Currently, the dogs in our local animal shelters consist of more than 50% pitbull and bully breeds. That percentage is likely closer to 75%. Every animal shelter houses multiple litters of pitbull and bully breed puppies at all times. We hope to dramatically and noticeably reduce the number of pitbull and bully breed litters born in our county by the end of 2025.

#### How does this program increase the number of sterilization surgeries above the existing baseline?

In early 2024, our organization opened a low-cost spay/neuter clinic in Okaloosa County. We are able to sterilize at least 60 dogs per week (plus 140 cats). While we will serve the general public, including other rescues and shelters, we have a particular focus on helping low-income families sterilize their pitbull and bully breed dogs with an aggressive voucher program.

#### Methods

#### What criteria will you use to determine eligibility for your program?

We will err on the side of being "too" generous with our vouchers as opposed to not being generous enough. If we feel a family needs help sterilizing a pitbull or bully breed dog, we will give them a voucher.

## How will you advertise the program? Explain how the advertising will reach the target audience.

We will coordinate with local animal control agencies, veterinarians and other rescues to connect with our target audience. At some point we may advertise the program to the public but for now we will rely on these partnerships to identify eligible recipients.

## How will you address barriers to full use of the program such as transportation, illiteracy, and cultural hurdles?

We are committed to helping everyone who needs help to access our services. Local animal control has agreed to coordinate communication and transport in the communities they serve.

Does this project involve the transportation of animals by someone other than the client? If so, describe the vehicles, methods for confinement, personnel training, liability releases used to assure the safety of the animals and handlers.

Local animal control agencies have agreed to coordinate transportation of animals from their communities to our facility. They will be given liability waivers for signature that protect both them and our clinic. Our group will not be providing transportation at this time.

We will work with animal control agencies, veterinaries and other rescues to distribute vouchers generously to families who express a desire to have their pitbull and bully breed dogs sterilized.

#### For your voucher program, how have you determined the capacity of the veterinarians listed above to handle the projected capacity?

Our vet is a trained high-volume spay/neuter surgeon. She can sterilize up to 40 dogs per day, depending on size of the dogs on the schedule. We expect to bring on a second high-volume vet in 2024.

Our basic goal and commitment is to bring in as many pitbulls and bully breeds from low-income families as we can handle in 2024, and beyond. We have the community relationships in place to efficiently facilitate making this happen. We have a team of more than 200 dedicated volunteers and a staff of 9 who will assist anyway they can to make the program a success.

Our package includes surgery, rabies vaccine and an e-collar. Crestview Animal Services has agreed to microchip their county's dogs at their cost. If we find that there are other services regularly needed we will discuss methods to get the covered, either by the client or outside donations.

We intend to run this program indefinitely, funded by other grants and an aggressive and comprehensive fundraising campaign.

We have a loyal following of generous supporters and have no doubt we will be able to run the program year-round, until there is no longer a need.
