Established in 1997, St. Francis Society Animal Rescue is an all-volunteer non-profit animal rescue organization dedicated to saving the lives of sick, injured and stray cats and dogs. In January 2021, after seeing so many unmet feral cat needs in the Tampa community, St. Francis Society created a structured TNR (trap, neuter, return) team. This team consists of nearly a dozen St. Francis volunteers dedicated to helping combat the large number of stray and feral cats in Tampa Bay. This team is committed to not only the trapping, neutering and return of feral cats, but also the removal of young kittens from their colonies for adoption. In 2023, St. Francis Society helped TNR over 2,500 cats in our community. St. Francis Society utilizes every known source for TNR surgeries in our community. However, as any trapper in our area can attest to, there are simply not enough TNR resources to combat the crisis of cat overpopulation in our community. Slomba Shelter Solutions offers a unique program that utilizes relief veterinarians, veterinary technicians and rescue group volunteers at clinics that are otherwise unoccupied on the weekend. They have successfully used this program in several Southeast cities of the U.S. to help fill the gap and have a proven track record of sterilizing over 6,000 animals in 2023 with this program. Our TNR team works daily with feral cats and is fully qualified on how to trap, transport, recover and release community cats. In addition to our TNR team, we will also offer free surgery space to other rescue group TNR teams who are fully qualified in TNVR.

Florida Animal Friend grants are for low-cost and/or no-cost spay/neuter programs; If you currently have such a program, please describe

St. Francis Society trappers have extensive experience in various types of humane cat trapping methods. In addition to finding cat colonies that need TNVR services, our trappers are also dispatched into the community after we receive a request for TNR help through our website. Since we do not have our own clinic, volunteers hold cats for next-day transport to one of the few clinics providing TNR surgeries. The cats also receive an ear tip and rabies shot as part of the service and are held overnight as a precaution. The volunteers typically transport the cats back to the colony the next day where they are released. This is a service to our community that our volunteers are truly passionate about and can instantly see how it impacts an area making a huge difference. Both the services and surgeries are offered to the community free of charge.

Objectives

What do you hope to accomplish with these funds (objectives should be specific and quantifiable)?

These funds will allow us to spay and neuter 500 feral and community cats currently residing in target areas of Hillsborough County, Florida.

How does this program increase the number of sterilization surgeries above the existing baseline?

With this grant, St. Francis Society will be able to increase the number of sterilizations in two ways. First, when available, we will contract with Slomba Shelter Solutions, LLC to engage relief veterinarians and veterinary technicians from across the state to perform TNVR sterilization surgeries. These free clinics will be held on Sundays when regular surgeries are not performed at the Humane Society of Tampa Bay and the surgery center would otherwise sit idle. In addition, we would also utilize some of the funding to enable our trappers to access Harmony Veterinary Clinics throughout the week. Depending on surgery loads, Harmony Veterinary Clinics allow us to bring in a few cats per day needing TNVR services. Having the funds to utilize these clinics is critical, especially when working with community requests involving pregnant females who should be sterilized immediately.

Methods

What criteria will you use to determine eligibility for your program?

Eligibility will be determined through a triage process where our volunteer trappers receive requests for assistance by the public, as well as when trappers discover new colonies. Some of the eligibility factors include the number of feral or community cats needing sterilization in an area. Are cats in immediate physical danger? Are they deemed a nuisance due to non-sterilized cat behaviors such as fighting and spraying? Are there kittens or pregnant females? The services needed are prioritized to determine the distribution of surgery appointments. Feral and community cats and will then be transported to the clinics in humane cat traps by volunteers, weighed, and deemed healthy enough for surgery as determined by a veterinarian. Kittens must weigh at least 2 pounds to be eligible for surgery.

How will you advertise the program? Explain how the advertising will reach the target audience.

The appointments at Harmony Veterinary Clinic will not require advertising as they will only be utilized by St. Francis Society trappers as they struggle to assist with the massive number of TNVR requests they receive from the public. However, the free clinics that we are able to contract with Slomba Shelter Solutions, LLC will be available to trappers throughout Hillsborough County. These clinics will be advertised on social media, with the Hillsborough County Pet Resource Center, with the Humane Society of Tampa Bay and by local cat rescues.

How will you address barriers to full use of the program such as transportation, illiteracy, and cultural hurdles?

We will use trappers, feeders, colony caretakers, and other volunteers to instruct the affected residents on the advantages of TNVR. Much of this contact will occur in person or through targeted advertisements. Contacts and instructions will be provided in Spanish where appropriate. Transportation of the cats will only be provided by trained trappers.

Does this project involve the transportation of animals by someone other than the client? If so, describe the vehicles, methods for confinement, personnel training, liability releases used to assure the safety of the animals and handlers.

The transportation of cats in humane traps from the trapping sites to the clinics will be done by rescue volunteers, cat trappers or colony caretakers that are all well versed in feral cat behavior and containment.

Veterinary Services

What arrangements have you made with veterinarians to perform the surgeries?

We have been in contact with Slomba Shelter Solutions, LLC and they have confirmed that they are able to provide relief veterinarians and veterinary technicians from across the state to perform the sterilization surgeries. We also work closely with Harmony Veterinary Clinics on a regular basis and are familiar with their TNVR surgery availability.

The grant will cover \$50 towards the spay and neuter surgeries, ear-tip and pain medication. St. Francis Society will cover the cost of the rabies vaccine, the FVRCP vaccine, and parasite medication if needed. For any surgeries performed at Harmony Veterinary Clinic, St. Francis Society will also cover the additional surgery fees above the \$50/cat grant award. No fees will be charged to the trappers, caretakers or community.

There are simply not enough homes available to adopt our way out of the homeless cat crisis in Hillsborough County and we must sterilize community cats to stem the tide. Our grant request aims to sterilize 500 cats and according to The Cat Encyclopedia, this will prevent the birth of over 16,000,000 homeless kittens over a 5 year period. Whether true or not, it is certainly true that sterilizing even one feral or community cat will prevent generations of suffering.
