Since 2007, the Humane Society of Tampa Bay has been performing feral and community cat surgeries for our TNVR program every Monday. Dr. Karla Bard is our Director of Medical Operations and she oversees this program. She has worked at the Humane Society of Tampa Bay for over 17 years and is a graduate of the University of Florida Veterinary School. In addition to Dr. Bard, we have 9 other veterinarians at our full service animal hospital who can assist with surgeries when needed. In 2014, the Humane Society of Tampa Bay's animal hospital was the first non-profit hospital in Florida to receive accreditation by AAHA. We received this certification again in 2016, 2019, and 2022 as well. Since 2007, we have sterilized over 86,000 feral and community cats through our TNVR program.

Florida Animal Friend grants are for low-cost and/or no-cost spay/neuter programs; If you currently have such a program, please describe

We currently have a TNVR program and have sterilized over 86,000 cats through this program since 2007. There is not enough funding for free-roaming and community cats, and many people who care for these cats cannot afford to get all of them sterilized. We would like to offer free TNVR services to help reduce the overpopulation of unwanted cats in our community. This program helps to reduce the unnecessary euthanasia of cats in the county municipal shelter and will reduce the number of cats coming in to both our shelter and the county shelter. This will positively impact the overall save rate for cats in our county.

Objectives

What do you hope to accomplish with these funds (objectives should be specific and quantifiable)?

With funding from Florida Animal Friend, we will provide free spay/neuter surgeries for 455 outdoor cats in Hillsborough County at no cost to the public. We will perform the surgeries for \$55 per cat and provide pain medication, rabies vaccine, and an FVRCP vaccine for each cat as well. We will also ear-tip all free-roaming and community cats. Our goal is to reduce the number of cat intakes and cats euthanized in Hillsborough County.

How does this program increase the number of sterilization surgeries above the existing baseline?

This program will allow us to sterilize almost 38 extra cats per month (for a total of 455 cats; we will cover the small difference remaining after the \$25,000 in funding is utilized to be sure all 455 cats are sterilized.) This will help to further reduce pet overpopulation, especially in Hillsborough County Shelters. We continue to see a very high volume of cat intakes, and a significant number of them are from public drop offs of litters of kittens born to outside cats. Providing more spay/neuter services for the public will help to decrease the number of homeless kittens born to outside cats.

Methods

What criteria will you use to determine eligibility for your program?

We will sterilize cats who go outside and have an owner who lives in Hillsborough County as well as free-roaming cats who have a caretaker in Hillsborough County. All cats will be vaccinated and free-roaming cats will also be ear-tipped.

How will you advertise the program? Explain how the advertising will reach the target audience.

We will advertise this program on our website (with over 50,000 clicks per month), on our Instagram, Twitter, and Facebook Pages (with a combined reach of almost 160,000 followers), and on our regular segments with media outlets such as Fox 13, NBC News Channel 8, ABC, and CBS, as well as Q105, 98 Rock, and 93.3 radio stations. We will also advertise through our email list to over 85,000 subscribers and have flyers available at both our shelter and Animal Health Center to promote this program and recognize Florida Animal Friend.

How will you address barriers to full use of the program such as transportation, illiteracy, and cultural hurdles?

We are very centrally located in Hillsborough County and easily accessible via public transportation, rideshare, and car. We also have volunteers who are able to transport people with disabilities or lack of any transportation to the animal hospital if requested. Our

Community Outreach and TNVR Coordinator can also take our transport van out to the county shelter or locations with multiple cats needing to be sterilized (such as apartment complexes and trailer parks) to transport them back to the animal hospital. To improve accessibility to multiple cultures in our area, the flyers can be translated into Spanish and we can have Spanish translators available to assist clients when they arrive.

Does this project involve the transportation of animals by someone other than the client? If so, describe.

Most animals will be transported by the client. Our TNVR transport van can also be used to help transport cats from specific locations or from the county shelter. Both our highly experienced Community Outreach and TNVR Coordinator and the transport vehicle will be covered by the Humane Society of Tampa Bay insurance. All animals will be transported in traps for safety.

Animeals Program/Meals on Wheels	The Humane Society of Tampa bay offers a food assistance program called Animeals, which is essentially a "Meals on Wheels" type of program for animals. We have volunteer drivers who deliver pet food to elderly, disabled, and homebound people every month to allow them to keep their pets at home. Meals on Wheels refers people in need to us for this program so that we can ensure that the pets are receiving proper pet food and supplies. Many of these recipients also feed outdoor cats and we provide TNVR services to these cats to be sure that they are sterilized and vaccinated.
Hillsborough County Pet Resource Center	We work closely with the Pet Resource Center and will continue to perform TNVR services for rescue groups in Hillsborough County who receive certificates from the Pet Resource Center for surgeries. They can also help us publicize the free spay/neuter services available to those in the community who would benefit from this grant.
Kitten Place	We work with this rescue group to assist them with providing sterilization services for feral and community cats. They will also be able to refer residents from the community to us who would benefit from free sterilization services.
Local Media	We have regular TV Segments scheduled with local news and radio stations, such as FOX, CBS, NBC, ABC, and Q105, 98 Rock, and 93.3 FLZ. We will be able to advertise the grant through these media outlets to help spread the word about this service to the Hillsborough County community.
Rescue Pets of Florida	We work closely with this local rescue group, and they will be able to help refer residents with community and/or free-roaming cats who would benefit from getting their cats sterilized with the help of this grant.
St. Francis Animal Rescue	We do a lot of work with this rescue group to help sterilize their pets. They will be able to refer residents with free-roaming and/or community cats to us to receive services as a result of this grant.

Overpopulation of cats continues to be a huge problem facing our local shelters, and our cat intakes are always very high. We are confident that this grant will help reduce the number of homeless cats and help to eliminate cats being turned away because shelters are so full, as well as reducing unnecessary euthanasia at shelters. Please note that we have not yet completed our tax filings for 2024, so the financial documents provided from 2024 are not the final audited versions, but there should not be any significant changes in the audited version. We are including the Form 990 filed for 2023 as that is the last one filed with the IRS as of now.
