What kinds of spay/neuter services are currently available in the target area and in what ways are these resources currently insufficient to meet community needs?
Nassau Humane Society, Cats Angels and Nassau County Animal Services have been working together this past year to address the free-roaming community cats problem throughout Nassau County and this grant would allow this good work to continue. From April - December 2024, we spay/neutered nearly 500 free roaming community cats.

# Objectives

## What do you hope to accomplish with these funds (objectives should be specific and quantifiable)?

We aim to continue our focus on addressing the needs of community cats in Nassau County by providing spay/neuter services for an additional 500 cats in 2025.

#### How does this program increase the number of sterilization surgeries above the existing baseline?

Our primary focus will continue to provide services for community cats through this grant. Animal overpopulation continues to be an issue Nassau County and we will continue our work support Cats Angels and Nassau County Animal Services to help keep community cats under control through a successful spay/neuter program.

## Methods

#### What criteria will you use to determine eligibility for your program?

We will continue collaborating with community partners to implement our Trap-Neuter-Return (TNR) program, helping to reduce the overpopulation of community cats. Whenever possible, adoptable kittens will be placed through Nassau Humane Society or Cats Angels.

### How will you advertise the program? Explain how the advertising will reach the target audience.

We won't necessarily advertise the no-cost spay /neuter program although we will work with community partners if they have an issue with community cats to trap, neuter and release. Through the Cats Angel volunteer program, they work hard to keep local community involved to alert when strays are spotted.

How will you address barriers to full use of the program such as transportation, illiteracy, and cultural hurdles? Both community partners and the NHS have transportation and the ability to set traps in areas where community cats are present.

## Does this project involve the transportation of animals by someone other than the client? If so, describe.

This no-cost spay/neuter initiative is not offered to clients but focuses solely on community cats.

Nassau Humane Society operates a full-service mobile medical unit, led by our dedicated surgeon, Dr. Niessen, DVM, to provide high-quality veterinary care to community cats, along with our own shelter animals. Dr Niessen is supported by three surgical vet technicians in this spay/neuter initiative.

The NHS is developing a Medical Fund to expand our in-house facilities, increasing our capacity to provide low-cost spay/neuter services for public pets while enhancing care for shelter animals. Ongoing fundraising efforts will sustain the fund, and revenue generated from low-cost spay/neuter services will be reinvested to support no-cost spay/neuter for community cats.
