TLC PetSnip has completed over 100,000 spay and neuter surgeries. While we had 3 clinics we have focused efforts on Polk County. In addition to offering low cost programs for the citizens, we also work closely with Polk County Animal Control to spay and neuter animals to increase their life saving measures, as they are the highest euthanasing shelter in the State of Florida. Our new Executive Director, Marie Herbster, used to be the Administrator at Polk County Animal Control and is used to managing 24,000 plus animals a year and managing a staff of 70 members. Since coming aboard Marie has increased our spay and neutering capacity over 1,000 percent.

TLC PetSnip's mission aims to address the issue of pet overpopulation and promote responsible pet ownership through its low-cost spay and neuter clinic. By providing affordable access to spaying and neutering services for animals, TLC PetSnip aims to reduce the number of unwanted litters, alleviate strain on animal shelters, and ultimately improve the overall welfare of pets within Polk County. This grant will enable us to expand our clinics reach, increase public awareness, and ensure that cost is not a barrier to responsible pet ownership.

What kinds of spay/neuter services are currently available in the target area and in what ways are these resources currently insufficient to meet community needs?  TLC PetSnip is currently the only non-profit clinic in Polk County. One non-profit clinic that provides affordable spay and neuter services to the largest growing county in the State of Florida. There is the SPCA and the Humane Society of Polk County that also offer spay/neuter services within our targeted area. There are not enough services to keep up with the population of animals within Polk county and the inflation of citizens.		

# Objectives

#### What do you hope to accomplish with these funds (objectives should be specific and quantifiable)?

We are going to have a Pitties and Kitties Campaign for those on any type of Disability, Social Security, or government assistance. We will also offer a last litter program for large breed dogs and cats, and offer periodic specials at even lower rates to help end the pet over population on those already breeding animals.. Large breed bully dogs make up a substantial number of the dogs being euthanized in our local shelter. We hope to alter 500 animals.

#### How does this program increase the number of sterilization surgeries above the existing baseline?

This program focuses on those populations most at risk of being in the shelter and provides an opportunity for those who would not normally afford to sterilize their pets. we anticipate an additional 500 pets with this grant funding and the focus on last litter will decrease those pets being born into an already overpopulated Polk County.

#### Methods

#### What criteria will you use to determine eligibility for your program?

The last litter program will be available for anyone whose pet has had litters of puppies or kittens. Our Pitties and Kitties day will be offered for those that can attend that fit that criteria. Those on any type of government assistance always get a half price spay or neuter at our clinic.

#### How will you advertise the program? Explain how the advertising will reach the target audience.

We will advertise on social media and with flyers. Historically our spots fill up very quickly when we advertise these special event days.
